1. SUMMARY

The purpose of this task was to create an activity in which the entire group of the network of 300 young people will participate in an [online event](#) in the format of an election campaign and the manifestation of the vote, after which will be selected 12 young people who will benefit from a study visit to Brussels during which will meet European parliamentarians that are assuming to represent the young people interests among EU and present a resolution document

It was agreed with the consortium partners that on the online event, there would be 6 candidates, one candidate from each country, to debate for each of the EYS goals, therefore 11 candidates were required in total from each country to partake. The selection criteria for candidates involved the following;

- age between 18-25
- priority given to participants with fewer opportunities
- English speakers – conversational level -interested in the topic of the project - Motivated to active participate in activities.

The event which was originally planned for November 2024 was postponed until December to allow partners to ensure that 300 participants were registered on the platform.

It was agreed that Livestorm based on its functionality would be used to facilitate the event and training sessions were provided for partners, youth workers and participants.

The event itself was due to take place on December 9th but changes to Wednesday 11th December because of Storm Dara

On the day itself, all the candidates that attended the event got to present their needs in order of the EYS goals. Once the presentation for each goal was completed, attendees got to vote, via a poll, for three need they would like addressed as part of the Resolution document. There was over 150 attendees at the event with over 30 candidates making presentations.

Following the online event, candidates were requested to provide a short video, to be uploaded to the Peer Civic platform, about who they are, why they got involved in this project and what needs they would like addressed. Based on these videos, participants could vote for their favourite candidate on the platform using likes. The candidates with the most likes were successful and now these candidates will get the opportunity to travel to Brussels, as part of a Study visit, and present their finding via the Resolution document to MEP's. The deadline for voting of candidates was extended due to the delay in videos from candidates.

The Plenary event took place, via a zoom meeting, on Wednesday 15th February at 16.00 (EET). The 12 successful candidates were announced at this event, each candidate gave a short presentation about the needs that are important to them. The next steps of the project were discussed together with proposed dates for the study trip to Brussels. The meeting was held using Zoom, hosted by Future Cast and assisted by the other project partners. There was over 160 attendees at the meeting.

2. PLAN FOR ONLINE YOUTH ELECTION EVENT

2.1 Purpose and Scope

Purpose: Activity in which the entire group of the network of 300 young people will participate in an online event in the format of an election campaign and the manifestation of the vote

Target Audience:

- age between 18-25
- priority given to participants with fewer opportunities
- English speakers – conversational level
- interested in the topic of the project and motivated to active participate in activities

Type of Election: Simulation of a EU Election

2.2 Events format

Virtual Platform: Livestorm will host the On-Line Event of 300 Participants

Note: Training and Test events will be organised ahead of the main event Events

Structure:

- 11 Goals in EYS
- Each Partner Country to put forward 1 candidate for each of the 11 goals of the EYS, therefore 66 candidates in total
- After the On-line event introduction, 11 breakout rooms will be created and each candidate will be assigned to their room
- 20-25 participants will be allocated to each room (pre-determined by survey of which goals interest participants, they can list in order of preference, and participants will be allocated)
- Following the local event training, candidates can choose which EYS Goal that they would like to present.

2.3 Agenda Planning

Pre-Event:

- **Registration:** All participants must be registered before the On-Line Event. YW to provide information to Partners regarding candidates for the event
- **Preparation Material:** Information about the candidates - Candidates must upload videos to the platform prior to the event about
 - What needs have they identified as important
 - And why we should vote for them

Event Day:

- **Opening Remarks:** Start with a brief introduction of the event, objectives, and process.
- **Icebreakers:** Include interactive sessions to break the ice and engage the participants. These could be fun polls or games related to elections.
- **Candidate Debates or Discussions:** Candidates can participate in debates or discussions on relevant topics using breakout rooms.

So for each EYS Goal there will be 11 breakout rooms, 6 candidates per room, one candidate from each partner country.

Breakout Rooms will require;

1. 6 Candidates (One from each Country)
2. One Moderator (Partner/Youth Worker)
3. One Translator (Translators will be able to move between rooms)
4. 20-25 Participants

Breakout rooms will run concurrently for 1 hour with an additional 10 mins for voting

1. Each candidate will be given 5 mins each to present three needs from their region. (6 candidates x 5 mins = 30 minutes)
2. Once the Candidates have presented, the floor will be open to participants to ask questions, using the chat room facility, for the moderator to read out (30 mins)
3. Poll will take place in each room at the end of the debate and participants will vote for their top three needs that are the most important to them (10 mins)

2.4 Voting


- **Voting of Needs:** to be performed in Breakout Rooms at the end of the debate.
- **Voting of Candidates:** Using the Peer Civic Platform, each candidate can upload videos and the candidates with the most likes will be given the opportunity to attend the study visit in Brussels and present the needs voted upon at the On-line event.
Voting for Candidates to close two days after the On-Line Event
Candidates can only receive votes from participants from the same country, similar to EU elections
- **Verification:** Only registered participants can vote.
- **Outcome:** The most popular candidates from each country will represent their Country in Brussels
- **Results Announcement:**
 1. **Voting of Needs:** To be announced at the On-Line Event following the Vote of the Breakout Rooms
 2. **Voting of Candidates:** To be announced via the platform two days after the On-Line Event following the Vote of the Breakout Rooms

2.5 Plenary Meeting

- On-line event for all participants to attend
- The 12 Elected candidates can make a short presentation based on the needs voted upon at the previous on-line eve




5. CANDIDATE VIDEOS & PRESENTATIONS

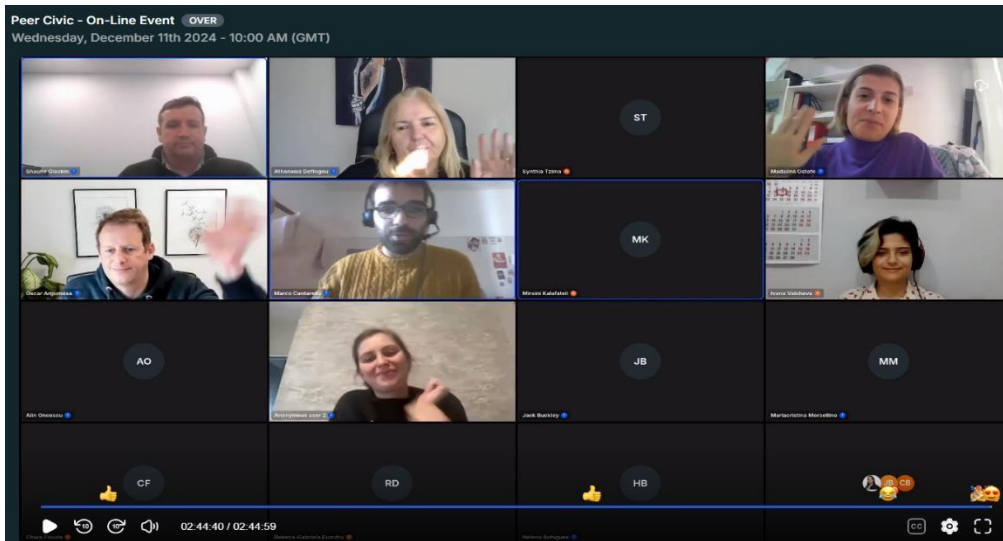
This initiative not only provided young people with direct experience in election processes but also strengthened their understanding of democratic participation, digital campaign communication and representation.

On-Line Event Report

All participants, candidates, Youth Workers and Partners were issued links to the event. All Moderators, Partners and Youth Workers were issued team invites. 3 No. tests events held to check functionality of Livestorm before Live Event

During the Event

Met with team members 1 hour before event went live. Informed of technical event link issues from Partners whose participants were trying to log on using their phone – Livestorm guidelines were issued on how to attend using the chat room to all attendees to share with participants experiencing log in difficulties

Breakout Rooms – due to the fact that numerous participants and candidates were having issues logging on and that some candidates and participants were unable to attend due to timing of the event, prior commitments, the time taken to set up the rooms took longer than expected and a result Partners made the decision to host the event in the Main room.

As a result, candidates in attendance were able to deliver the 3 needs aligned to the EYS Goal, unfortunately due to the fact that the Breakout rooms were not engaged, it meant that there was not time for debates. However participants got to vote, using polls, on the needs presented on each of the EYS Goals.

Whilst the event had over 150 attendees at its peak, as the planned event ran overtime, there was a drop off of attendees towards the end of the event

After the Event

Candidates videos were uploaded onto the platform so that participants could commence voting of candidates until Monday 16th December. Some videos took longer to upload than others due to the limited upload when using a YouTube Channel. An instructional video was provided on the platform on how vote for candidates to all participants following the On-line event
