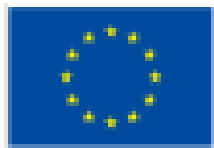

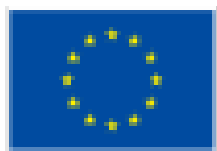

Places of Interest

- 1.** Grand Place: A UNESCO World Heritage site, this central square is surrounded by stunning historic buildings, including the Town Hall. Address: Grote Markt, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 2.** Manneken Pis: The iconic statue of a little boy urinating, a symbol of Brussels. Address: Rue de l'Étuve 31, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 3.** Atomium: A futuristic structure and museum, built for the 1958 World Expo, offering panoramic views of the city. Address: Square de l'Atomium, 1020 Brussels, Belgium
- 4.** Parc du Cinquantième (Parc of the Fiftieth Anniversary) A large park featuring a triumphal arch and several museums, ideal for relaxing walks or exploring the surroundings. Address: Avenue de la Joyeuse Entrée, 1040 Brussels, Belgium
- 5.** Mont des Arts: A cultural and historical hub offering scenic views over Brussels, connecting the city center to the Royal Palace. Address: Mont des Arts, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 6.** Royal Palace of Brussels: The official palace of the Belgian king, open to the public during summer. Address: Rue Brederode 16, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 7.** Galeries Royales Saint-Hubert: Luxurious shopping arcades with boutiques, chocolatiers, and cafés housed in a stunning 19th-century building. Address: Galerie du Roi 5, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 8.** Museum of Musical Instruments: A fascinating museum with an extensive collection of musical instruments from around the world, housed in an Art Nouveau building. Address: Rue Montagne de la Cour 2, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 9.** Saint Michael and Saint Gudula Cathedral : A magnificent Gothic cathedral, dating from the 13th century, with impressive stained glass windows. Address: Place Sainte-Gudule, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 10.** Sablon District (Le Sablon): Famous for its antique shops, art galleries, and the beautiful Church of Our Blessed Lady of the Sablon. Address: Place du Grand Sablon, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 11.** Magritte Museum: Dedicated to the famous Belgian surrealist artist René Magritte, featuring his most iconic works. Address: Rue de la Régence 3, 1000 Brussels, Belgium

- 12.** Autoworld: A car enthusiast's paradise, this museum showcases vintage cars and the evolution of the automobile industry. Address: Parc du Cinquenaire 11, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 13.** Jeu de Balle Flea Market: A vibrant flea market where you can browse antiques, second-hand goods, and unique treasures. Address: Place du Jeu de Balle, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 14.** Belgian Comic Strip Center (Centre Belge de la Bande Dessinée) A museum celebrating Belgium's rich comic book heritage, including Tintin and the Smurfs. Address: Rue des Sables 20, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 15.** Train World: An interactive museum that explores the history of railways, with full size trains and immersive exhibits. Address: Place Princesse Elisabeth 5, 1030 Schaerbeek, Belgium
- 16.** Mini-Europe: A park showcasing miniature versions of Europe's most famous landmarks, from the Eiffel Tower to the Acropolis. Address: Avenue du Football 1, 1020 Brussels, Belgium
- 17.** Bruparck and Kinopolis: A leisure park with various entertainment options, including a cinema multiplex for moviegoers. Address: Avenue du Football 7, 1020 Brussels, Belgium
- 18.** Laeken Greenhouses (Serres Royales de Laeken): The Royal Greenhouses, only open to the public in spring, showcase stunning botanical collections in a grand setting. Address: Avenue du Parc Royal, 1020 Brussels, Belgium
- 19.** Bozar (Palais des Beaux-Arts): A dynamic cultural center that hosts exhibitions, concerts, and events, housed in an iconic Art Deco building. Address: Rue Ravenstein 23, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
- 20.** Place Sainte-Catherine: A lively square known for its restaurants, bars, and vibrant nightlife, and the famous Christmas market during winter. Address: Place Sainte-Catherine, 1000 Brussels, Belgium
